Accomplishments included the successful incorporation of the BNJ Foundation in the state of Kansas and the inclusion in the 2012 Combined Federal Campaign (CFC). Our Website continues to be a powerful tool in both spreading awareness and receiving feedback. We provided health and wellness programs thorough the year to many seniors. We continue to work to help vulnerable children, lower the rates of world hunger, improve senior health and change the lives of villagers.

Major Initiatives and Programs

Health and Wellness Program in USA

The BNJ Foundation provided positive suggestions by addressing health risks to over 60 seniors in Fairfax County, VA. Discuss the results of the screening tests, and advising seniors on steps they can take to reduce the risk for heart disease and hypertension. Promote healthy nutrition and physical activity.

Health and Wellness Program in Cameroon

The BNJ Foundation has implemented a health fair reaching 600 residents with services such as blood work, treatment of minor injuries, child births, malaria treatment, prophylaxis and immunizations, HIV testing, parasite prevention, tuberculosis testing, minor dental hygiene, tropical disease education such as cholera, dysentery as well as STD prevention. These health fairs involved several healthcare providers, students, volunteers.

Youth Program

The BNJ Foundation provides youth the opportunity to explore learning and experience personal success. Students volunteer in program such as "Clean Fairfax". Older students work as mentors and tutors to the younger students.

Feeding Program

The BNJ Foundation partner with shelter in the community to help feed the hungry, by cooking fresh nutritious, tasty and healthy meals, including fresh fruits, veggies, and salads. Food is purchased by the BNJ Foundation, prepared and served to families as needed. Bake goods are also available.

Helping Villagers in Cameroon

The BNJ Foundation is dedicated to providing support to overlooked communities, enabling people to stay in their villages by working with them to improve their lives and livelihoods. Projects include providing food and seeds, land for farming, healthcare support and training, building wells, and disease prevention program. The BNJ Foundation community farm support hundreds of families at no cost to them. Families received the seeds, pesticides and also the land where they cultivate. These sustainable projects are giving hope to families and allowing them to stay in their villages in spite of poverty.

Education for Village Children

The BNJ Foundation promote learning motivate and empower children to learn by supplying educational material. Most of the rural children have never owned a book. Education is a way for success for children in rural areas. We have received donations of some great books and passing those to children. We plan to build a library in the village to store those books.




BNJ FOUNDATION MISSION
